

Minutes of the Special General Meeting held Thursday 5th September 2013.

President John Hammond in the Chair.

Meeting opened at 8.00pm with 107 members and guests present.

A special general meeting was called to consider the changes to our club's Constitution following recent changes to the Incorporation Act.

Peter Vibert *moved* a motion "To rescind the old rules and adopt the new rules" This was *seconded* by Chris O'Hara.

Peter spoke on the motion and the amendments made by the committee to the standard Consumer Affairs rules. Many changes had been made by the committee to best reflect the position of the GVMVDC and Peter recommended the acceptance of the new rules.

Phame McCall brought to the attention of the meeting, several mistakes within the proposed rules which required correction. These points were discussed and appropriate changes made to correct the errors.

CLUB CAPTAIN'S REPORT:

Club Captain Hugh detailed the following upcoming events.

- Euroa Show & Shine on 6th October. The departure time from Kialla Central at 8.30am was questioned as possibly being too late to be able to park as a group, and that we should leave at 8am. It was discussed and decided that the 8.30 departure time would remain, with club members who wanted to leave earlier could meet the rest of the group at Euroa.

RALLY REPORTS:

Hugh told of the club's visit to Marong, with the group travelling to Harcourt on the Saturday for a visit to the Morris Garage. The group overnighted at Castlemaine before travelling to Marong on Sunday to attend the Federation Picnic Day. A good turn up of club vehicles attended the day with some 500-600 vehicles being present. Lloyd Healey won a trophy with his Fiat tractor.

John Truman told of the sale of a front end loader for a Fergy tractor at Echuca Steam Rally, which ended up on a tractor which took part in a recent trip from Cooktown to the Cape and back.

Drivers Journal

Allan Weeks was on a bus trip around Alice Springs and while at Marlo a group rode in on motor bikes. They had ridden from Adelaide to Darwin and return in 10 days. Apparently the entire group was well beyond the "numb bum" stage and looking forward to the end of the trip.

President John told of a group of motor bike riders called the "Far Riders" who travel long distances on motor bikes. They have to travel to designated places and be at that location within 24 hours. Evidence must be provided to confirm their start and arrival times. Apparently one of the group had travelled from Newcastle to Perth in 92 hours and after a 4 hour rest, tackled the return trip which took 98 hours.

Lloyd Healey reported on the display held at Emerald Bank, with horses, tractors, cars and animals included in the display. Planning is now underway for next year's event.

John found a Farmall tractor in the display that had belonged to friends and that he had ridden on as a child in Bacchus Marsh. He was also involved in the recent election voting and attended many nursing homes to allow elderly citizens to cast their vote. He was amazed at the number of people who had dementia and not able to clearly indicate their choices, while other 100 year old people were still very sharp and able to vote.

DELEGATES' REPORTS -

AOMC - Graeme Smith reported on the recent AOMC meeting with little happening since the last meeting. There is still a difference of opinion between the AOMC, Federation and VicRoads on changes to the Club Permit Scheme. Our club needs to establish a position to convey to Graeme to allow him to vote at meetings to reflect the desired outcome for our club.

The next meeting is to be held in November.

President John agreed to consider the club's position at a future meeting to provide direction for Graeme.

John then told of a recent experience at a VicRoads agency and his frustration while trying to register a vehicle.

Federation – Lloyd Healey attended the Federation meeting at Komwak and Lloyd also highlighted the different positions of all parties in the Club Permit Scheme. Some 590 clubs are now involved in the scheme, with many not being affiliated with either organisation. The proposed "M" prefix plates for Club Permit vehicles will not happen as this is used by Government departments. The ideas submitted by the AOMC on modified vehicles is not supported by the Federation. Changes will see only one person from each club able to sign Club Permit renewals forms. Some clubs still do not understand their obligations and conditions when signing up to the Club Permit Scheme. Insurance for Club Permit vehicles seems likely to increase. Grants of \$750 were provided to four clubs. Bendigo swap is booked out and ready for the day.

CATERING COMMITTEE REPORT:

Anne Podbury advised that the roster for catering positions at the swap had been printed in the Journal. All helpers were asked to be on time and allow the reliever to take their place.

The breakfast for the Veteran Car Club had not been confirmed at this stage. Brendan Walsh detailed plans for the itinerary and the rally is looking for people able to assist with marshalling.

BUILDING COMMITTEE REPORT:

Peter Borthwick told of the building committee activities, which include having an excavator doing some cleanup work around the grounds, improving drainage and preparing the footings for the new storage container.

The irrigation system had been repaired and the weed spray program commenced.

The new shelving for the kitchen had been installed and the photocopy table has been provided.

A quote had been received for shutters to close off the kitchen, which at \$1900 seems too expensive, and at this stage will not progress. It will be reconsidered at a later date with different options.

The hot water supply to the toilets is still an ongoing issue, with additional quotes deemed to still be too expensive. Quotes are around \$3,000 - \$4,000 depending on the size and style of unit being considered.

Terry Dovaston considers the installation of a hot water service to not be of benefit, with hospitals and medical services instead using bacterial spray to control possible infection.

Peter advised that he will be away for 2½ months and that Ken Cuthbert will fill his role in his absence.

SWAP COMMITTEE REPORT:

Lloyd Healey advised that he still requires helpers on gates for Sunday at the swap meet. He then detailed the roles of helpers in the different positions during the swap activities.

Lloyd disagreed with the decision regarding the hot water service being too expensive, with the swap likely to make a healthy profit and that we had sufficient funds to cover the installation of a decent hot water unit.

GENERAL BUSINESS:

- John reminded members that it was time to consider recommendations for the club's annual donations to charity - members to forward their suggestions to committee for consideration and a recommendation at the next general meeting.
- Brendan Walsh has received a how to vote card from the Australian Motoring Enthusiast Party, which detailed their position and preference in voting. (PS Looks like they may have had one of their members elected.)
- Allan Weeks read out a short story of a gentleman with a dog by the name of Sex, and the trouble that this had caused him throughout his life.







Veteran Car Club of Australia National Rally, Shepparton – 15th-20th September 2013

If you didn't get a chance to see the cars that came to Shepp for this rally, you missed a rare sight. About 120 of the 150 entries were lined up at Vic Park Lake on the Wednesday, in glorious sunshine, at least for a while. Most had seen the black clouds gathering and left by the time the 3-minute storm hit! But before then, it was a fantastic display of an amazing array of veteran vehicles, from a little 1900 Locomobile steamer to an imposing 1918 Cadillac V8 tourer.

The big shed at the showgrounds was the base for the week-long rally. Entrants left their veteran cars in the shed knowing they were safe and secure, left their car trailers outside on the asphalt area and drove their modern cars back to their accommodation. It meant a lot less stressful driving through the middle of Shepp in cars that aren't easy to drive in traffic and don't always have good brakes.



The weather was the only issue. The rally started on a balmy Sunday night with a cocktail party at the Park Lake. But Monday's run to Dookie and Violet Town was awful. Cal was driving Daryl's 1908 Renault with Mietta Innes-Irons and they both got soaked, even with coats on. That sort of weather doesn't suit a car with no windscreen or roof!

In contrast, Tuesday's run to Euroa was perfect. It was cool and dry, overcast and still – perfect weather for veterans. Wednesday was the very short run to the Lake for the big display.

Thursday's run to Murchison, Rushworth and Tatura and Friday's run to Tongala and Kyabram were pretty good, with just the occasional light shower. Lots of people were out to see the cars, including plenty of club members at Kyabram Fauna Park.

There were a few vehicles there that stood out from the crowd. The 1907 Stanley Steamer always draws a crowd, especially its snake-shaped horn that spits out steam! Another interesting entrant was the 1907 Aerocar, apparently the only one in the world. It was powered by an air-cooled four-cylinder engine and was driven from Tasmania. Well done Ken! You also don't see two Armstrong-Whitworths side by side very often. There were 27 Model T Fords entered, many going on to their own national rally in the Barossa Valley a week later. The most unusual one was a re-creation of a Lamsteed KampKar, an early type of campervan.

The rally finished with a dinner at the GV Hotel on Friday night and Saturday breakfast at our clubrooms. I think most entrants had a great week and many are considering attending next year's National Rally even though it will be in Kalgoorlie!

Pride and Joy

1928 Whippet Model 96 tourer - John and Jenny Grieve

We bought our Whippet from Keith Raverty in the early 70s in unrestored condition (see photo). We had a choice of the Whippet or a Chevrolet baker's van. We chose the Whippet because we liked the idea of glass windows that could be opened and closed (called Jaken side curtains). Boy, did I regret that decision when it came to restoring them – it took months to clean and paint the frames, get new glass cut, buy long lengths of rubber and cut into strips for sealing, etc. etc.

I stripped the car down to a bare chassis, which I cleaned by hand and then painted. The rust was cut out of the old body panels and new pieces welded in by Ken Young from Ardmona. The woodwork was done by my good mate and great club member Lou Corbet.

The paint work and dent repairs were done by Peter Mark, which resulted in Jenny and me doing many hours of putty rubbing and filing of body filler. When the painting was finished, the car was sent to Freers' Panel Shop in Mooroopna, where John Florence did a great job of the seats and hood.

I was able to overhaul the gearbox myself, fitting an FJ clutch plate and late model thrust race.

The diff was checked out and found to be OK, New wheel bearings were fitted front and rear. All brake lining and bands were replaced along with new king pins and bushes.

The engine was rebored and new pistons and bearings fitted by an engineering firm in Shepparton. Again Jenny and I spent many hours sanding down all the wheel spokes and staining them before applying many coats of varnish.

WHIPPET — Toledo, Ohio — (1927-1931) — The Whippet was wonderfully named. It was small and it was swift, and it was both those things in the superlative. At its introduction in the fall of 1926, the Whippet was America's smallest car, its wheelbase 100½ inches, its engine a 134-cubic-inch 30 hp four, with a 40 hp six on a 109½-inch wheelbase following in January 1927. That the Whippet was swift was effectively demonstrated when one of the sixes was taken to the Indianapolis Motor Speedway for a 24-hour endurance run which was completed at an average 56.52 mph to establish a new American record for stock cars priced under \$1000. And the Whippet was priced well under a thousand, with a four-cylinder cabriolet at only \$545 in 1928 (five dollars less than a comparable Ford), and the six's price range that year reduced to \$615-\$745 ("the world's lowest priced six" was an advertising slogan). The Whippet was produced by the Willys-Overland Company of Toledo, and superseded the Overland. Among the reasons for its carrying its own identity (complete with stylized Whippet typescript and Whippet emblem of the namesake dog jumping through a hoop) was probably the misfortunes having greeted earlier Overland attempts to market a contender in the lowest-priced field. The Whippet had its own distinctive personality, and a European look. The latter was largely the result of its development by Willys-Overland-Crossley Ltd., a subsidiary which John North Willys had set up in England in 1920. (Moreso than any other manufacturer, Willys had recognized the potential importance of export and had committed considerable effort to it; by 1913 no fewer than 37 countries, from Java to Bulgaria, had Willys-Overland dealerships; the first automobile agency in Iceland was the Overland dealerships; the first automobile agency in Iceland was the Overland dealerships; the first automobile are specification — four wheel mechanical brakes, seven-bearing crankshaft, full pressure lubrication to all bearings except piston pins, Nelson Bohnalite in

The draft by-laws will be printed in the November Journal for your consideration before discussion and a vote is taken at the November meeting.


At that meeting, it is intended to pass one resolution:

AOMC Report

AOMC Report - October 2013

There has for some time been concern in a number of quarters about heavily modified vehicles (not Street Rods) joining the CPS. Such vehicles are not subject to engineering inspection. It is clear that in some quarters of VicRoads the intention is that the rules to be applied to modified CPS vehicles should be those recently introduced for vehicles on full registration. Those rules are contained in documents known as VS18 and VSB14.



In essence these rules would make the definition of a modified vehicle very narrow and would mean that a very large number of CPS vehicles would be caught

in the net, meaning that quite minor alterations which have evolved on cars over many decades would require VASS inspection. (Could cost \$3000) A lot of our vehicles were placed on Club Plates when all we required was a safety check by a member of our Club.

VSB14/VS18 legislation has been endorsed by the Federation saying we are in favour of the idea. I believe we are not and should accept the AOMC modifications proposal, that we treat older vehicles in three age categories.

Up to 1949

1969 on

VicRoads have hinted that modified cars now on Club Plates will be allowed to remain, but if you sell your modified vehicle it must comply with VSB14/VS18 and have a VASS inspection. So let us decide "What are modifications?" not VicRoads. Get behind the AOMC.
