Wednesday morning we journeyed to J Ward in Ararat, a hospital for the criminally insane, a very depressing place. Leaving Ararat we




travelled through the countryside, lunched at Dunkeld, before arriving in Portland to our very nice motel overlooking the Port. Another fun night in the dining room with much laughter.





Veteran Car Club 1 & 2 Cylinder Rally, Cobram – 15th-18th March 2018






