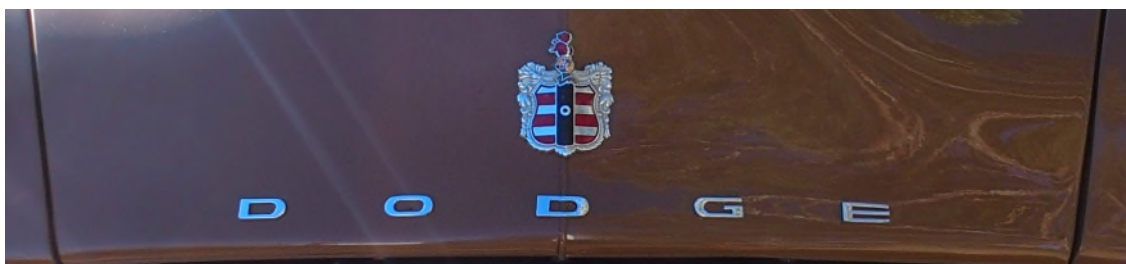

We learnt that Furphy water carts were part of military training camps in Australia in WWI but at overseas campaigns the water carts did not come from Shepparton as they were built by HV McKay in Sunshine and another Australian factory.

## Decade driving life changing education

BILL Winters has created a local legacy, helping more than 400 learner drivers to obtain their P-plates as Berry Street's L2P program coordinator.

L2P is a community-based program developed to assist eligible young people who otherwise do not have access to a supervising driver or an appropriate vehicle, to gain driving experience and confidence behind the wheel.

"We've made a big difference as a group. It has had its challenges, but we have managed to create a successful program that has been extremely rewarding. None of it would be possible without trainers, volunteers, administrators, and all the people working to develop this program as it has grown over the years," said Bill.

"Having survived a motor crash myself, I looked at driver education 12 years ago, and I thought there must be a better way to educate young people and to keep road users safe.

"There have been highs and lows, but for the most part, it has been an extremely positive experience working with younger people to help

them gain driving experience."

The L2P Program currently operates in Greater Shepparton, Moira, Mitchell, Strathbogie and Mitchell shires, and they are always looking for more mentors to assist taking young learner drivers for drives to assist them to get their hours up and graduate to P-plates.

Mentors should be people who are interested in working with young people. Berry Street will

help you obtain a police check and Working with Children card, and provide training, insurance, fuel, and a car to teach your mentee.

The second \$500 grant will be used to plan an afternoon outing for seniors in Toolamba and surrounding towns. The social outing aims to connect participants with other local seniors and volunteers working on the day.

## Feel-good fundraising keeps the wheels turning

IT IS only through community spirit that GV Hospice Care has been able to grow and to provide end-of-life care for patients and their families on weekends, holidays, and after-hours.

"Hospice provides a free palliative care service 24-hours a day, seven days a week, 365 days a year, but is funded by the Victorian Government for office hours only," said GV Hospice Care president, Jeanette Powell.

"We are very fortunate to have a very supportive and generous community who provide the extra funding so we can provide our service after hours and on the weekends and holidays."

After-hours support is fully funded by community efforts like donations, through the GV Hospice Op Shop, and community groups and events. Over the last year, \$136,000 was contributed by the community.

One generous contributor is the GV Hospice Rallye. Over 26 years the annual motoring event has raised more than one million dollars. This year was their most successful, having raised a record-breaking \$100,000!

The rally is a navigational challenge on sealed roads and all kinds of vehicles are welcome to participate, from vintage cars to the daily run-around.

"Almost everyone knows of Hospice and their incredible work. The community is so generous because they want to see this important after-hours service continue. The Rallye was cancelled one year due to Covid, and we came back this year and raised our largest sum yet," said committee member Min Innes-Irons, a classic car enthusiast who has participated in 17 rallyes and served as chair for seven years.

"The Rallye committee works tirelessly to put on these events to support an important local cause. All committee members are volunteers, such as the likes of Bill Parsons, who drives the Rallye," said Min.

"Families and the next generation are all encouraged to take part. It's a great deal of fun. We aim to have a good mix of cars and people every year."

## Revealed: Piastrì to replace Ricciardo at McLaren in 2023

After much drama in the past week over the future of Oscar Piastrì, RacingNews365.com has learnt that the Australian will be racing for McLaren in 2023.

Alpine reserve driver Oscar Piastrì has agreed a deal to race for McLaren in 2023 in place of Daniel Ricciardo, **RacingNews365.com** has learnt.

The Australian's future has been the subject of much debate this week, with Alpine releasing a statement on Tuesday saying Piastrì would replace the Aston Martin-bound Fernando Alonso at the French squad next year.

However, in a remarkable turn of events, the 21-year-old released a statement of his own just two hours later refuting the claims that he would be racing for the Enstone team in 2023.

Piastrì was known to be admired by other teams, having previously been linked with a loan move to Williams, and **RacingNews365.com** has learned from sources in Australia that Piastrì has signed a contract at McLaren that would see him partner Lando Norris and replace compatriot Riccardo at the Woking squad in 2023.

FIA's contract recognition board, where all F1 contracts are checked for validity, is said to have validated Piastrì's new contract with McLaren at the expense of his existing deal with Alpine.

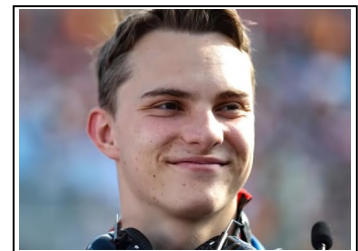
**RacingNews365.com** understands that Piastrì has a contract with Alpine for 2022, but not for 2023. His 2022 deal is said to contain an option on Piastrì's services for 2023, but that option was not exercised within the required 30 days of signing that contract.

The FIA's contract recognition board ruled that there was no valid contract between Alpine and Piastrì before 2023, leaving McLaren free to agree a deal with the Australian.

Piastrì's deal with McLaren was said to have been finalised on the evening of July 30, before Fernando Alonso's move to Aston Martin was confirmed on August 1.

Under Formula 1's regulations, Alpine cannot challenge the board's decision, as F1 teams have previously unanimously decided that it is the highest body that can rule on contractual matters.

Piastrì's move leaves Ricciardo's F1 future up in the air. The Australian's best bet may be replacing Alonso at Alpine, for whom he drove in 2019 and 2020 in its previous guise of Renault.

Survey of Club Members

At the July committee meeting, a few minutes were spent discussing future threats to heritage motoring clubs and the hobby of their members. As our world moves toward a zero-carbon economy there is increasing community acceptance of public policy that discriminates against the internal combustion engine (ICE).

We need to be prepared to have a say about where heritage motoring is positioned as society rejigs its priorities.

Locally we have not yet been impacted, but we are aware of talk about potential problems. Some overseas countries have already adopted policies to discourage ICE vehicles. Examples include stricter emission controls, annual emission checks at road-worthies, restricting locations where operated, fuel excise, higher registration fees.

Our task will be to show heritage motoring is not part of today's transportation system. Rather, it provides our community/society with a carefully curated fleet, at no cost to the public purse, that demonstrates both the diversity and evolution of vehicles over the past 125 years. It performs a similar role to that of the custodians of steam powered machines.

Swaying public opinion starts with good data. We need facts to back up our words. Then we need skilled publicity that can spread the 'word' about our hobby including its technical, social and community heritage benefits. The Association of Motoring Clubs (AOMC) and the Federation of Veteran, Vintage and Classic Car Clubs (FVCCCC) will be part of this process. But to be influential they also need facts, particularly those from their affiliated clubs.

A survey of our membership could start the process. The committee believes that the skills to devise, collate and interpret such a survey are within our club. So we are suggesting a survey sub-committee for this task. The survey could focus on aspects of what the club does plus what members value and hope for with their heritage motoring hobby. It will be a great opportunity to learn more about our club and to even have a hand in shaping its future.


At the August general meeting, members interested in volunteering to assist can make themselves known. If unable to attend on August 11 please contact a committee member or the Secretary if you would be prepared to assist.




*FIVA is the World Federation for Historic Vehicles. It carried out a similar survey in 2020-2021, collecting data from almost 55,000 enthusiasts around the world.*
