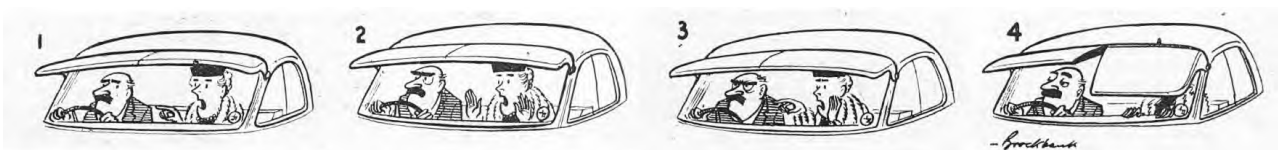

General Meeting Minutes

Minutes of the General Meeting held Thursday 13th October 2022 at the clubrooms with 44 members and two visitors in attendance, and apologies from 18 members being recorded. Extraordinary wet and stormy conditions were being experienced together with about a 20-minute power failure during the meeting.

President David Grant opened the meeting at 8pm.

Minutes:

A motion for acceptance of the minutes of our September 8 meeting, as published in the Journal was moved by *Ray Harrison* and 2nd by *David Vibert*, then agreed to by members. No business arising.

Correspondence:

Several magazines from car clubs plus two items for Treasurer's action (water and hire of showground account).

Secretary, Barry Croke, made particular mention of an email from Consumer Affairs Victoria. This required voluntary organisations which engaged in fundraising activities that acquired more than \$20,000 annually to be registered with CAV. Non-compliance could result in severe penalties. Although the CAV directive was not explicit, it appeared to be directed toward organisations raising funds for appeals to benefit others. Our club's Swap activity was for the sole benefit of GVMVDC and Barry Croke indicated he will therefore recommend to our Committee at its next meeting that we do not disclose our fund raising activities.

Correspondence report accepted on the motion from *Barry Croke*, 2nd *Bill Holyman*.

REPORTS:**Treasurer's Report**

Peter Vibert tabled a five page report of transactions in the period Sept.8 to Oct.13 plus a table showing account balances. *Peter Vibert* moved, *Leigh Johnston* seconded the motion that was accepted for this report.

Events s/c

Hugh McFadyen indicated that the Oct.19 coffee run to Euroa/Avenel would be cancelled due to floods and rescheduled for Nov.23. The run to Euroa to visit Bruce Hargrave's gallery would proceed on Sunday Nov.6 with lunch at Euroa Hotel. Please advise Hugh if attending. The Mid Murray run has two spots left. The Chrysler National Gathering brought 115 cars from WA, NSW, SA and Vic with these visitors most impressed with MOVE, and particularly thankful for our catering s/c's great job.

Swap

Lloyd Healey thanked members for the help and support that made our Swap event such a success.

Julie Mahoney also noted the support provided by members in catering for the Swap event.

Members were urged to make their payment for the Anniversary Celebration Dinner (see Journal) as this is the only reliable indicator for attendance.

Maintenance s/c

Greg Sutherland noted the effects of wet weather on weed spraying opportunities and the impact of V/Line's associated vehicles using our parking area. David Grant stated that following his meeting with the V/Line site manager this project group will make good our yard with gravel plus repair the damaged entrance railing.

Social s/c

Trevor Dainton indicated 20 members attended last Saturday's clubroom gathering and that the next meeting would be in November.

Club Survey

The survey has been distributed with the October Journal. Barry Croke emphasized that it was not necessary to answer every question. It was more important to provide information each member regarded as relevant. Completed survey forms are required by Nov.10 (AGM).

Library

Neil Hammond made particular mention of the book "Around the World in a Ford Model A".

Club History

David Grant stated that club members were being slow to respond to the request for a photo plus some words about themselves and their vehicle(s). Mention was also made of Ken O'Connor's production of videos with the life members that would be edited for availability on USB sticks.

Guest Speaker

Trevor Dainton introduced member Bill Simpson who spoke of Camp Quality trips with Fizz Mayberry and Steve Clark since 1997 in their 1962 Pontiac Catalina station wagon. Their solutions to numerous challenges this ex-hearse presented over 16 years was part of the story that enabled them to raise \$496,000 for the Camp Quality organisation to assist children.

Other Reports

Defibrillator : David Grant noted he had to spend \$500 for the new battery and was checking the recommendation for new pads.

Membership fees : Members were reminded that valid registration of their red plate vehicle depended on their annual club subscription being paid before the November AGM.

Motorclassica : Neil Hammond attended the Exhibition Building for his eleventh visit to this event. He spent some time describing cars that were on show and noted his dismay that entry payment on the day had to be done by telephone.

New Honour Board : The President noted its arrival and thanked Phil Podbury and his son-in-law Peter for producing it.

Nomination for Office Bearer Positions : President reminded members to have these with the Secretary preferably a week before the Nov.10 Annual General Meeting.

The Meeting concluded at 9.10pm and was followed by supper.

- Treasurer Peter presented his financial report, including a list of club members that have Club Permit vehicles who have not yet paid their subs.
- Details of the proposed Club 50th Anniversary celebrations were provided.
- Ken O'Connor provided an update on the Club's history book. It will be completed early next year and available to members, along with some extra features.

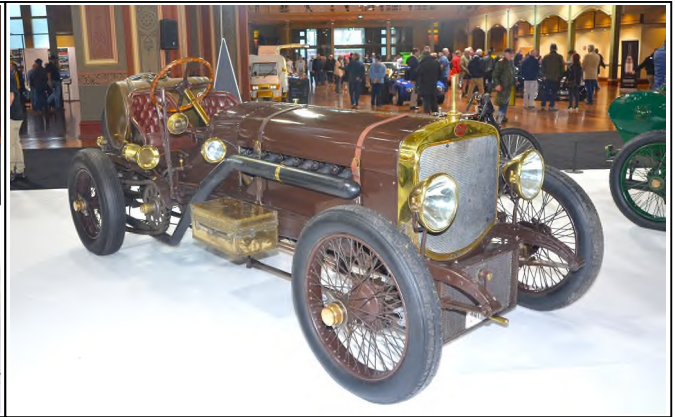

Rally Report

RACV Alpine Trial Centenary – 15th-23rd October 2022

The RACV and The Vintage Driver's Club joined forces to celebrate the 100th anniversary of the first Alpine Trial organised by the RACV in November 1921. Unfortunately, it had to be postponed – like so many events – from 2021 to 2022 so it became the 100+1 celebration. The week-long event recreated the original route as close as possible, starting at RACV in Noble Park with night stops in Traralgon, Lakes Entrance, Wodonga, Bright, Mansfield, Healesville and finishing at RACV Creswick.

Due to the postponement, my original entry in the 1922 Chenard Walcker could no longer attend, and I thought that meant I wouldn't either. Fortunately, Min Innes-Irons was looking for a navigator for the first three days and very generously offered me the seat in the Brescia Bugatti. Sadly, the Broken River had other ideas for Min, and he was unable to join the rally until Day 4. Again, I thought I wasn't going to be a part of the event. A couple of phone calls later, I had offered to be a support vehicle – the Organising Committee were very supportive as one of their planned support crews were unwell and couldn't attend.

We headed off from the start line behind *Shepparton Adviser's* Geoff Adams and his remarkable 1922 Bentley 3L, the first Bentley to arrive in Australia, which partook in the 1922 event (↓). Faced with a dry and sunny Saturday morning, and once through the numerous traffic lights of suburbia, we made our way to Traralgon for the opening dinner. Day 2 to Lakes Entrance saw the rain chase us all morning, with early leavers staying mostly dry and the last to leave receiving multiple drenchings throughout the morning. Following a stop into a lovely winery, entrants had the second night in Lakes Entrance free to prepare for the challenging next day. An early start was needed to undertake the 200-mile crossing of the Australian Alps on Day 3. We followed the Great Alpine Road from Bruthen to Omeo, then onto the Omeo Highway to Mitta Mitta and onto Wodonga. Many of the entrants took the opportunity to detour from the rest stop in Mitta Mitta to see the very impressive Dartmouth Dam spillway in action. Day 4 was a relaxed day through to Bright. Coffee at Beechworth was where Min joined the run, after fording creek crossings to get there, and when I returned to Bannockburn.

It was a fantastic few days, and my sincere thanks must go to Min and the VDC for keeping me involved in the event.

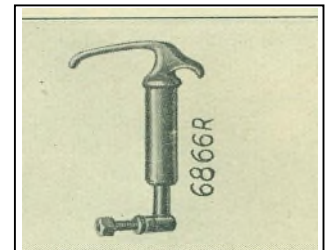

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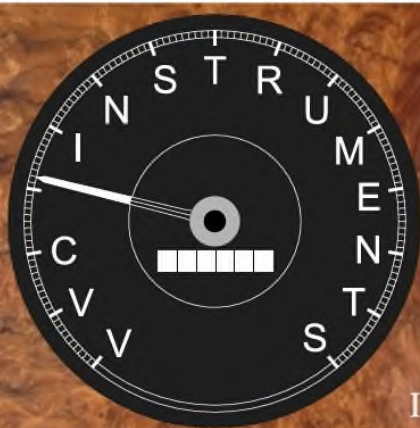
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
