




General Meeting Minutes

Minutes of the General Meeting held Thursday 8th *December 2022 at the clubrooms with 73 members and three visitors in attendance, and apologies from 7 members being recorded.*

President Neil Rutherford opened the meeting at 8pm noting meeting and facility protocols. Three visitors, Gordon McDonald plus Tony and Liz Farrugia were welcomed. All have now attended their third introductory club event and in the process of seeking to be club members.

Minutes:

The minutes of the November general meeting, as published in the December Journal, were accepted following the motion from *Allan Weeks*, 2^{nd} *Vic Baker*. No business arising from these minutes.

Correspondence:

Inwards - Four motoring newsletters from other clubs and Bendigo Bank monthly statements.

Outwards -

1. Electronically transmitted annual report to Consumer Affairs Victoria indicating required financial reports of the past year, plus the name and contact addresses of the secretary/public officer and payment of the \$61.20 annual CAV fee. A telephone conversation with a CAV staff member also enquired about CAV's ruling on our revised constitution submitted earlier in the year. The response indicated that their computerised file showed it as being received and because we had not heard anything it could be presumed acceptable.

2. "Delegated Responsibilities" letters had been given to members who carry out eleven important club activities that have been delegated to them, and associated members in their group, by the Committee. These letters fulfill Rule 40 requirements in our constitution.

Barry Croke moved, 2nd *Ray Harrison.* Correspondence accepted and members approved.

REPORTS:

Treasurer's Report

Peter Vibert tabled a three page report of transactions in the period Nov.10-Dec.8 plus a page indicating account balances. Notable comments included mention of a \$1505 donation to GV Hospice Care that came from the band who entertained at the club's anniversary dinner dance gifting their \$660 nominal fee, GVMVDC gifting another \$340 and the remainder coming from raffle proceeds at the celebration.

Our club had paid \$1000 to the Numurkah Rotary Club for the assistance eight of their members gave to operate one of the barbeques at our September Swap Meet. Defibrillator pads to be purchased following recommendations on 'use-by' functionalities. Later discussion indicated seven members present were qualified to use it and some thought a refresher course desirable. Moved *Peter Vibert/2nd Vic Baker* that the report be accepted.

Events s/c

Leigh Johnston gave home vegetable gardeners some perspective on their relevance when he described some details about the 5755 acre horticulture enterprise visited during the East Gippsland rally. Reference was then made to the forthcoming events listed on pages 6 and 7 of the December Journal. Additional comment was made about the Targa display at Swanpool 9am-1pm on January 15, the date of our club's twilight run to Nathalia.

Catering s/c

President Neil asked Julie Mahoney for the report, and in doing so noted the wonderful result of the subcommittee's work for the anniversary activities. Julie thanked members for their assistance.

Swap s/c

Lloyd Healey spoke about ongoing legal and insurance broker discussions that have not resolved club liability issues associated with stall holders when there are more than 200 sites (we have about 600+). Nor can we 'onsell' insurance to stall holders by charging them some \$40 to buy insurance on their behalf. Investigations continue.

Facilities Maintenance s/c

Greg Sutherland noted the weed control, ground cover planting and fence work done at a recent working bee. He also listed items to be attended to

- Audio system in clubrooms
- Tiling of the BBQ surrounds
- Water system timer
- Fence painting

V/Line had spread grey gravel at the parking area entry but the club may need to consider further gravel sheeting.

Social s/c

Col Grace drew attention to the Journal listing.

AOMC

Alan Lavis mentioned the carbon offset now available for historic vehicles whereby a \$36 payment can be volunteered so AOMC organises a contribution to tree planting that supposedly 'makes up' for 6000 km annually of vehicle operation. AOMC and Federation to meet on December 13.

Reports from the floor

Don Brisbane achieved notoriety by being the first citizen to park in the new Shepparton Mall following its official opening.

Guest Speaker

Rob Fletcher introduced a variation to this segment by screening an interview Ken O'Connor had made with Ross Organ. This was one of several such interviews with Life Members as part of gaining a history acquisition for the club. Ross' recollections of club activities in the early 1970s showed we had moved into another era, particularly his former role of permit scrutineer for vehicles. Members present expressed overwhelming appreciation of Ross' tales and that entertainment gained from Ken's ability to have Ross expound on these former times.

Rob Fletcher concluded the session asking that members assist him by suggesting guest speakers for our meetings this year.

The meeting closed at 9.09pm with Neil Rutherford wishing members a good Christmas and New year. Our next general meeting will be on January 12, 2023.



These celebrations were to have taken place on this date two years ago. Unfortunately, due to COVID-19 restrictions over the past two years, the club wasn't able to celebrate this special occasion until now.

Music was provided by The Splinters Group, whose members kindly donated their payment to GV Hospice.

All proceeds from a raffle held on the night, along with a contribution from the management at the Woolshed, were donated to GV Hospice as well.

an enjoyable weekend. The team work has been phenomenal.






