

Minutes of the General Meeting held Thursday 9th February 2023 at the clubrooms with 70 members and one visitor in attendance, and apologies from 22 members being recorded.

President Neil Rutherford opened the meeting at 8pm, advising members of a number of matters.

- Club room defibrillator; a refresher course for members wishing to be competent in it's operation is being organised. Members were asked to indicate their interest in attending such a course on a circulated sheet.
- New members were welcomed; Riley Banner and his father, Brett were welcomed into the club. Michael Cannon was also welcomed as a new member.
- The passing of Club member for 48 years, Enid Tobias, was marked by the gathering rising for one minute's silence in a mark of respect to her long standing input into the club.
- Trophy presentations; Former Club Captain, John Truman, presented the following trophies to people who attended the November Concours.
 - **Ken and Dawn Muston** (1934 Chrysler CV convertible sedan); in absentia
 - The John Stewart Trophy for Best Presented Vehicle
 - The Barry Collison Trophy, People's Choice
 - **Peter Vibert** (1975 MG B GT V8 coupe)
 - The Dusty Shaw Trophy for the Best Individual Effort
 - **Brian and Evie Boschetti** (1976 Honda CB750 K6 motorcycle)
 - The John Hill Trophy for the Best Motorcycle
 - **Kris Healey**; The Rolls Royce Trophy for Club Member of the Year
 - **Brendan Walsh and Peter Vibert** were each presented with a club trophy in appreciation of their efforts in maintaining the functioning of our club during the period of Covid restrictions.

Minutes:

The motion of *Allan Weeks*, 2nd *Lloyd Healey*, for acceptance of the minutes of the January 12th meeting gained the meeting's support.

Correspondence:

Outwards – Letters had been sent to Lloyd Healey (Federation rep.) and Alan Lavis (AOMC rep.) with the Committee's recommendation that Barry Croke's paper 'Background notes about greenhouse gas emissions' be forwarded to each of these motoring organisations.

Inwards – Origin Energy indicating price increases for their supply of gas to the club rooms, indicating the likely charge would be 96 cents per day.

SWAP stallholder insurance – Two letters from local insurance brokers indicated that despite each of them approaching 10 different insurers they were unable to arrange purchase of cover for liabilities associated with stallholder activity and our club's ultimate ability to defend claim actions.

Correspondence was accepted following the motion moved by *Barry Croke*, 2nd *David Vibert*.

REPORTS:**Treasurer's Report**

Peter Vibert presented a table of transactions between January 12 and February 9 plus a statement of account balances as of February 9 2023.

The Treasurer's report was accepted after being moved by *Peter Vibert*, 2nd *David Grant*.

Events s/c

Hugh MacFadyen acting for Leigh Johnston referred to the extensive list of upcoming events as published in the February Journal. He made particular mention of the 'Red Plate Day' organised for February 12 where members would have a great opportunity to have their club vehicles checked over at no charge by qualified mechanics, and in addition being able to socialise with members and enjoy a bar-be-que lunch at no charge. Members should bring chairs and eating tools.

An additional activity not organised by our club but of interest to members will be a function at MOVE on Feb.17, 6-8pm. It will involve a large display of a variety of vehicles.

Another motoring exhibition is scheduled for Seymour on March 15. Details will be printed in next month's Journal.

President Neil also mentioned another as yet unlisted event, this is the National Motor Heritage Day set down for May 21 with our club intending to present a large display of club vehicles on the lawns by Lake Victoria. As part of AOMC's organisation of this National Day they have asked that our members have their cars photographed at the Red Plate Day for future publicity of the event.

SWAP Report

Lloyd Healey mentioned insurance problems noted in Correspondence.

GUEST SPEAKERS:

Vice-President Rob Fletcher introduced our AOMC rep. Alan Lavis who provided a short presentation about arrangements AOMC have made with Greenfleet to enable members of clubs such as ours to purchase carbon offsets. This money would be used by the Greenfleet organisation to plant and maintain forestry stands that would take up carbon dioxide.

Payments can be made to Greenfleet at the rate of \$18 for 3000km travelled or \$36 for 6000km. Alan Lavis also recommended that members with an interest in the topic, especially it's relevance to the Heritage car club movement, should request from Barry Croke a copy of his paper 'Background notes about greenhouse gas emissions'.

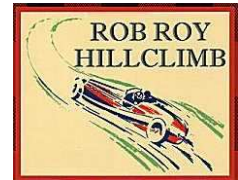


Rob Roy Revival, Smiths Gully – 18th-19th March 2023 **CORRECT DATES******

Federation delegates' meeting, Little River – 11th February 2023**Guest Speaker** – Geoff Gwilym, CEO of VACC

The VACC is interested in yearly roadworthy checks but because of a lack of statistics, the government and VicRoads have no interest.

He also spoke about electric vehicles but didn't really tell us much at all.

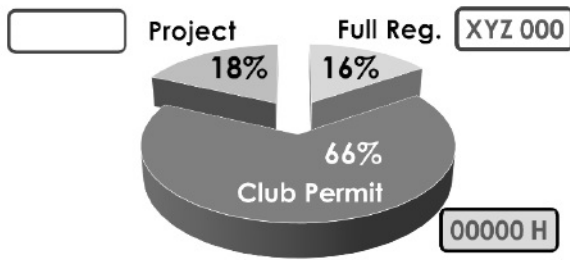

It is assumed that the 46 survey forms submitted, some 23.4% of the club's membership, is a representative cross-section of the club's vehicles.

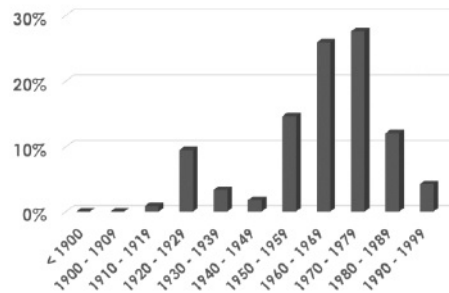

AGE:

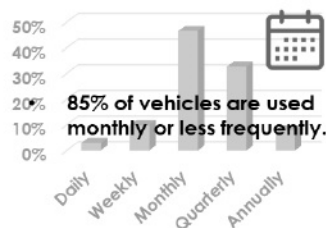

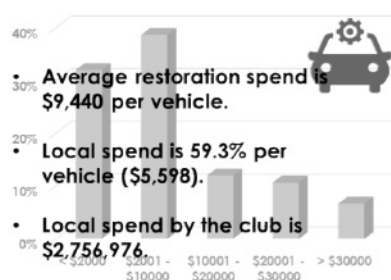

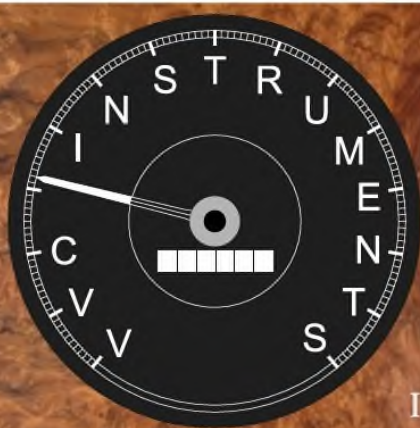
