

General Meeting Minutes

Minutes of the General Meeting held Thursday 13th April 2023 at the clubrooms with 66 members and one visitor (David Lacey) in attendance, and apologies from 18 members being recorded.


Phillip Island Classic 2023 – 9th-12th March 2023

The first Melbourne to MOVE rally was apparently a big success, with about 40 cars, trucks and buses making the trip from Derrimut to Shepparton.




The run started at CMV Truck and Bus in Derrimut where breakfast and route instructions were handed out.







Club Member Survey

2022 CLUB SURVEY OF MEMBERS : PART 4 - MEMBERS' OPINIONS

Recent Journals reported on survey responses about members and their vehicles, vehicle usage and maintenance, plus ideas on club activities. In this "opinions" part the survey, responses mostly depended on your written comment, and as expected, only about 75% of members chose to elaborate. The following comments are my interpretation of these responses.

1. Club cater for all ages and genders?

Most members considered this is being done and several wrote about organisation being excellent and particularly notable in achieving gender balance in activities. Ten members expressed concern about younger people not participating for a variety of reasons.

2. Should GVMVDC have position statements on some issues?

This section sought opinion on five issues.

2.1 Heritage motoring's comparative carbon dependency relative to various other past-times and hobbies

Some 64% said we should be able to make a statement, with 20% indicating it as unimportant and others not responding. Comments provided indicated the need for our clubs to provide analyses that show the minimal use of our vehicles gives our club's objectives a relatively low carbon dependence.

2.2 Contribution of our presence in community

About 90% of respondents believe we should work on our community profile.

2.3 *Contribution our activities make to local economy*

Again 90% indicated we should make this known.

2.4 Contribution our activities have for members' mental health

Again 90% of members regard our club activities, plus member interaction on matters related to their hobby, as extremely important opportunities, especially given that the majority of membership are retired citizens. Similarities with the community role of the men's shed movement was mentioned and the possibility that heritage motoring probably involved more people.

2.5 *Our role as custodians of motoring heritage?*

Most important that we promote this role of our club (92%). Comments included:

- AOMC and Federation should present a united approach,
- our fleet is a mobile museum, admire and enjoy,
- our hobby must not be regarded as a burden on the planet.

3. Opinions on improving community perception of GVMVDC

About 30 responses could fall within the following ideas; men's shed analogy, local parades and fund raising, involve young people, more frequent community exposure, public ride days, tree planting, use evidence of the survey.


4. Suggestions about preparing GVMVDC for a low carbon economy

Half of those replying made a considered written response. There was a clear expectation that clubs maintain a watching brief and act in the interest of members who are creating our motoring heritage.

Other suggested ideas fell within the following comments;

Emphasise our cars receive little use and therefore have minimal detrimental impact, lobby to show legitimacy of our hobby and the role of our club(s), automotive history is our responsibility, remain active and in front of community perception, our carbon dioxide generation is insignificant in the overall picture and it should not threaten heritage motoring clubs, electric vehicles do not publicise the full consequence of their environmental impact, be ready to resist any embargo on our club's motoring activities.
