

Vice President's Report

At a recent club outing, one of our committee members undertook an impromptu review of the status of club permit vehicles in attendance. 'Why,' you may ask, 'is a committee member checking on club permit vehicles?'. A good question; I'm pleased that you asked. VicRoads' Club Permit Scheme rules include provision for a club's approval to participate in the Scheme to be revoked if club members engage in non-compliant or inappropriate use of a vehicle on a Club Permit.

Now, back to the review results; they were quite encouraging, with 96% of vehicles complying with the requirements of the Scheme. Well done you! Unfortunately, it does mean that 4% were not complying, so for that 4% I will reiterate the requirements for participating in the Club Permit Scheme:

- 1/. Pay your Club Permit Renewal fee when it is due. The onus is on you to know when your permit expires and to renew it by that date, even if VicRoads haven't quite gotten around to issuing you with a renewal notice;
- 2/. Remember to affix the new Permit label to the windscreen of your permit vehicle when you have paid the renewal fee;
- 3/. Complete an entry in your Permit Logbook for each day that you use your vehicle, in non-erasable ink, not pencil (*what are they inferring?*); and
- 4/. Ensure that you affix your Permit plates and your Permit label to the **correct** vehicle; an easy mistake to make in these days of competing demands for your time and attention

Because the Club Permit Scheme is a permit to operate an unregistered vehicle on public roads, failure to comply with the Scheme's requirements places you are at risk of being penalised for driving an unregistered vehicle. Penalty? 962 of your hard earned. And if that were to result in the Club's approval to participate in the Scheme being revoked? Not happy Jan!

- Note to Western District Historic Vehicle Club accepting their offer of "Backfire" being sent by email rather than hard copy. Committee to discuss how members access such emails in the future.

Barry Croke recommended acceptance of the report and *Hughie MacFadyen* 2nd. Passed.

Treasurer's Report

Transactions (May 25- June 8) and account balances were presented by Peter Vibert as a two page report. Noted that the club funds provided a \$514 supplement to \$486 of cash donation to Peter MacCallum received at our May 21 display of vehicles. This Committee decision received acclamation. *Peter Vibert* moved, 2nd *Lloyd Healey* and report accepted.

GENERAL BUSINESS:

Club subscription outlook: Initial discussions that would lead to a recommendation for '23/24 membership fees started thinking at the May Committee meeting. Peter Vibert outlined that our club would have an annual operating deficit of about \$20,000 without the SWAP income. This is a shortfall of about \$99 per member. Other club income of \$13,400 is essentially the result of the \$70 membership fee. Members discussed the importance of SWAP income, comparison of fees with other clubs and suggestions of increasing fees to as much as \$100 annually. Committee to determine recommendation on fees for the August or September general meetings.

- Journal display: Allan Weeks drew members' attention to the wonderful five page photographic display in the June Journal. Brendan Walsh had sorted by year of manufacture order for the 83 cars on display on May 21. Acclamation followed.
- Club banners: The new indoor club banner was noted and Brendan Walsh is to design a display of members' cars for two feather banners to use at outdoor events.



Welcome Back Tour, Hamilton - 9th-12th June 2023

Our family usually gets together for this rally. This year we had four cars attending - 1922 Chenard et Walker, 1939 Standard Flying 8, 1958 Ford Zephyr Mk II and 1965 Jaguar 3.8 S-type. They all performed very well, the Jag doing over 1000km for the weekend.







We don't often see other GVMVDC members at this rally due to the distance but Doug and Jenny Andrews were there in their Riley drophead →. While there, one of the other Riley members presented Doug with a framed certificate for 50 years of membership of the Riley Club − well done Doug.



Entrants could check in on the Friday evening or

Saturday morning and the actual rally started with three groups heading off on Saturday to different destinations. The Casterton Kelpie Festival is always popular and one group headed that way for the day.

Group Two headed west to visit the Wannon Falls and the Nigretta Falls. Both falls are on the Wannon River and are only about 10km apart.

Groupe Three followed a 1925 Dodge (not mine) to Penshurst for a look through the Volcano Discovery Centre. We checked out a second-hand book shop in Penshurst and came home with a few bargains!

Sunday's run was north to the historic town of Harrow, outbound via Clunie Station and home via Coleraine. At Clunie's woolshed Ψ we were given a very interesting talk about the history of the property and the current farming that takes place there. We didn't get to the homestead but did get to check out a couple of original stone buildings on the property \mathbf{Y} .





At Harrow we had some lunch and then checked out some of the town's historic buildings and displays. The trip back was through the beautiful countryside Ψ around Pigeon Ponds, Koonongwootong and Coleraine. The official rally dinner was on the Sunday night.



Monday started with the traditional breakfast at the club's base in the Hamilton Pastoral Museum, before a short trip to Dunkeld to visit their Historical Society and sawmill. We cut our trip home down by about 30km by leaving from there!

There is always so much laughter and we hear some amazing stories that we think need to stay at the Lunch (what happens at the Lunch, stays at the Lunch).



AOMC Report

Meeting Notes of the AOMC Delegates Meeting Monday, 22nd May 2023

There were 72 delegates in attendance representing 65 clubs.

President's Report: Keith Mortimer reported that the committee have been working on a strategic plan for the next 5 years, covering areas such as member services, communications, external engagement and research & data. More details will be released when the document is finalised.

A submission has been made to the Federal Dept of Infrastructure regarding their fuel efficiency standards consultation.

The Australian Motoring Heritage Foundation will be conducting a survey of enthusiasts and clubs in relation to the economic value of the movement. This will be released soon and will be sent to clubs.

Treasurer's Report: Mark Fenton, AOMC Treasurer, reported that the AOMC finances are currently in a healthy position, and as of the end of April 2023 the AOMC Cash at Bank is \$290,838.00. Events in progress such as the Florence Thomson Rally influence these accounts significantly as revenue and donations are received but are not immediately expensed.

However, the British & European Motoring Show completed earlier in the year has been finalised and has contributed lower than normal revenues of under \$7,000 due to the high costs of running the event at the new Caribbean Park venue. But with the support of RACV we have been able to fund multiple events throughout the metropolitan and country areas to recognise the importance of Motoring Heritage Day as we continue to promote the movement that we represent, while the Florence Thomson Rally, which is organised and run by the AOMC with the financial support of RACV, also provides a forum to promote the heritage vehicle movement to the general community, in this case also recognising the contribution women have made to the motoring world.

It is heartening to see the emergence from the COVID-19 doldrums with funding being used to support current AOMC initiatives such as the upcoming Management and Restoration Seminars as well as other member services and advocacy programs the AOMC committee is actively working on. The time will soon be upon us when we ask all Clubs to renew their membership with the AOMC and we look forward to your ongoing support as we embark on these programs to ensure the ongoing health of the movement that we all believe in.

As we approach the end of the financial year it is also comforting to be able to report that with the professional support of a newly appointed accountant (Terry Stramotas from Benjamin King Money) the AOMC will be able to continue to finalise and satisfy all financial reporting obligations.

The AOMC has satisfied all statutory/compliance requirements and there are no areas of concern with respect to our ability to meet existing financial obligations while funding our strategic initiatives.

VicRoads/CPS Report: AOMC and Vic Fed have formed a working group that has been meeting for the last 6 months, and have been looking at arranging a meeting with VicRoads. Keith Mortimer and Neil Athorn finally met with VicRoads and presented several issues to them and stressed the need for ongoing meetings. The issues raised were: abuse of CPS; display rights; retention of log books; confusion around H & M plates; how many vehicles and clubs are on the CPS.

Code of Conduct: Tony Hall spoke to the draft Code that was published in the May newsletter. The committee are happy with the wording, but are seeking feedback from clubs. All responses should be emailed to Tony.

AOMC Events:

Florence Thomson Tour. Maureen Ross reported on this event which was based in Wangaratta and attracted 170 people and 81 vehicles. An event for women only drivers.

National Motoring Heritage Day: Several events were held around the state yesterday, and reports were given on them by participants. Clubs are encouraged to send a few photos and a short paragraph on what they did on NMHD.

Shannons American Motoring Show: Will take place on Sunday November 19th at Caribbean Park.

Club Management Seminar: Will be held on Saturday June 17th and will cover the business and mechanics of operating clubs. Will have several specialist guest speakers on relevant topics. Aimed at club officials.

Restoration Seminar: Saturday July 15th. Series of presenters, speakers and trade tables on the day. Bookings essential and limited to two per club.

Guest Speakers

John Lambert gave a talk on club members that volunteer in the community, and suggested that delegates take back to their clubs that charitable organisations are looking for volunteer drivers to assist with their programs.

Daryl Meek gave a very informative talk on his project of digitising the early Victorian registration details. He showed how these records can be used to trace ownership of vehicles, and to assist in genealogical research.

As part of his talk, Daryl outlined the history of the early records, from there being only 50-60 vehicles in Victoria in 1903; the introduction of the Motor car Act in 1909 that provided the framework for registration and licensing. Many of the early records were published in Police gazettes and in Auto Trade manuals and had details of registration number, owner and location.

Daryl's intention is to publish these records online for free access, and he is looking at linking photographs of vehicles with the record. He asked if anyone has a photo of an old vehicle with its number plate visible could they please send it to him to be added to the database. The vehicle needs to be Victorian, have its registration number and vehicle type and any known history.

Chairman Keith Mortimer declared the meeting closed at 9.20pm



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
