

**President** Neil Rutherford opened the meeting at 8pm with advice on meeting arrangements and facilities. He also welcomed visitor Don Needham and made particular mention of Robin Fletcher's role in acting for him in his absence with such excellent outcomes.

#### **Minutes:**

The minutes of the August 10 meeting, as published in the September Journal were accepted following the motion of *Allan Weeks*, 2<sup>nd</sup> David Vibert.

# Federation North West Tour, 27th August-2nd September 2023

The Tour started from the **Marong Federation Picnic** on 27<sup>th</sup> August, and visited Kerang (two nights), Swan Hill, Echuca and Shepparton (two nights) over the week.

There were 36 cars, mostly with two people on board, ranging from a 1927 Amilcar to more modern and comfortable classics, including three towing period caravans. (The "Golden Oldies" Tour is a similar Federation rally for vintage vehicles, which is run each alternate year.)



Entrants came from a wide area, including Ballarat, Bendigo, Melbourne, Sydney, and of course, GVMVDC Inc. The GVMVDC Inc. crew consisted of the Healeys, Johnstons, Grieves, Lindsay Braybon and Lavis's.

This report outlines some of the highlights of the Tour, rather than blow-by blow details.

**Kerang:** After checking in to our motel, we were invited to a private museum in town; a collection of assorted household / farm / workshop items. And what a collection it was. There were thousands of items, mostly well restored. If it had brass, it was polished! - an excellent collection.

**Kerang** is a modern, prosperous regional town, providing all of the services we take for granted. I have been driving past the clock tower in the main street for 50 odd years – it is the **Kerang Memorial Clock Tower**, built in 1933 in memory of the sports mistress of Kerang High School, who drowned in 1927 while conducting swimming lessons in the then swimming "pool" in the Loddon River. I will bet that you didn't know that either?

We had lunch at the Rotary/Kerang Car Clubrooms, hosted by the **Kerang and District Vintage Motor Club**. It was a nice lunch at a nice venue – well done.



The Quambatook Heritage Working Machinery Museum has a great collection of vintage harvesters, headers and tractors, reflecting the rich grain and wool growing heritage of the area. The site is adjacent to the Tractor Pull arena which Quambatook is famous for. The town is also famous as the place where John Williamson (singer/songwriter – "Mallee Boy") grew up.



The 40 km trip to Quambatook also showcased the "Car of the Tour" and its driver Colin Maginnity. The 1927 Amilcar C4 (think French Austin 7) is a 1003 cc (those 3 cc make all the difference!) two-seater "sporting car" with no side curtains or generator. The morning was cold and foggy, with Colin dressed like an eskimo and still shivering. The Amilcar completed all the runs, sitting on about 75 kph. Well done, Colin.



**Barham-Koondrook** – the highlight of our run to Barham was the **Border Flywheelers Club Heritage Museum**, which is housed in an old brick factory, complete with brick kilns (no longer working). A feature of the museum was the working (but not for us!) steam boilers and engines. There is also a good collection of tractors and farm machinery, and many good displays.

Barham-Koondrook is also the home of "The Great Australian Squeeze" orange juice. The family-owned business grows oranges on an orchard at Barham, and juices and bottles them. We saw the fruit receival, juicing plant and packaging plant in Koondrook. The Great Australian Squeeze is great OJ, and is stocked in Safeway – we are back having OJ for breakfast now!

**Swan Hill**: En-route to Swan Hill we called in to the **Lake Boga Flying Boat Museum**. The Catalina and the display of the war-time base is excellent. The morning tea they put on wasn't bad either.

From Swan Hill we headed out to **Nyah West**, to **Ron Dehne's Ford Tractor Collection**. Lloyd and John were in heaven! Ron and Marilyn have over 120 tractors, mainly Fords and under cover. Ron also has some trucks and earthmoving equipment. It sounds like a hobby that got away from them? There is a sign in the lobby, I think quoting Marilyn: "Once we had money, now we have tractors." They put on a good afternoon tea too.





On the run from Swan Hill to Echuca, we headed out to **Benjeroop Hall,** on the bank of the Loddon River, for morning tea (of course!). The **Benjeroop** area got a hiding in the October 2022 floods, and also in 2011. It hasn't really recovered, as a lot of the irrigation water has been sold out of the area, and once prosperous farms are now really just hobby farms.



One of the Hall Committee members, who had restored the engine and built the display with a grant, demonstrated the starting and operation of the pump. What a fantastic effort from such a passionate group!

required a steady supply of redgum firewood to produce gas. For display purposes, it is run on LPG.

At the Hall, they have built a great working display of a restored **Hornsby Gas Engine Irrigation Pump**, which was imported over a century ago for irrigation on a NSW property. It consists of a 3 m high by 1.5 m cylindrical gas producer (remember gas producers on cars during the war?), a spark ignition engine (maybe 5 hp?) with a 10 tonne flywheel, driving a 20 inch Robinson centrifugal pump. To operate it

**Echuca**: Dinner in Echuca was at "**The Great Aussie Beer Shed and Heritage Farm Museum**". The beer can collection would have to be another hobby that ran away! It and the old farm equipment are a great display, and he makes a good presentation.

The **National Holden Motor Museum** at Echuca had a great collection of Holdens of course, and an impressive air bag demonstration.

The **Echuca and District Vehicle Club** put on a nice bbq lunch at their Rotary Park clubrooms, prior to our departure for Shepparton.

**Shepparton**: Obviously, the GVMVDC Inc. crew had no problem securing motel accommodation here.



While we love these venues, they are even more impressive for visitors. Just the runs to visit them give a good picture of our region, particularly at this time of year.

Where do you take car clubs visiting Shepparton? MOVE, Southern Rod and Custom, Maskell's Custom and Classics and Tim and Maree Harris' petrol pump collection are a pretty good start.



The **Club Catering Committee** catered for two dinners, a boxed lunch and breakfast. I might be biased (never!), but these meals were excellent; the best that we had on the tour. Well done caterers!











### National Show and Shine, Euroa – 01st October 2023








# **AOMC Meeting Notes**

#### AOMC Delegates Meeting, Saturday August 26th, 2023 - Ballarat North

There were 57 attendees (41 clubs), 2 visitors and 5 zoom attendees. Chair: Iain Ross, VP, AOMC Guest Speakers

**Nick Scarff.** A young enthusiast who is studying for a Degree in Design. His thesis is the marketing of early Jaguars in Australia. It will include a background on Brysons Industries who imported Jaguars in the 1960s, and highlight the lack of academic histories on automobiles.

**Wayne Drew**, President of the Ballarat Light Car Club. Wayne gave a presentation on the club and club activities. Wayne showed some videos of various club events and some historic footage of racing at the racecourse pre-war.

Correspondence. AOMC secretary Tony Hall reported on several items of correspondence relevant to clubs.

- Incorporation Act information has been sent to clubs. AOMC have sought legal and accounting advice on the changes. Initially it looks like no effect for clubs, but we will notify of advice when it is received.
- Cheque books are being phased out, with banks ceasing to issue replacement books from November 2023. Clubs need to transfer to digital banking, or organise some extra cheque books soon.

**Treasurer's Report.** Mark Fenton, AOMC Treasurer, reported that the AOMC finances are currently in a healthy position, and as of the end of July 2023 the AOMC Cash at Bank is \$ 342,611.

There are no areas of concern with respect to our ability to meet existing financial obligations while funding our strategic initiatives.

With the end of the financial year for 2023 behind us, preparations are now underway to complete the financial reporting requirements for the upcoming November AGM, as well as to complete the Income Tax Returns for 2023. The requirements for tax reporting by NFPs were highlighted during the AOMC Management Seminar held in June, and efforts are being made to complete our own reporting in a way that potentially informs the preparation of reports by AOMC member clubs. Efforts are also being made to ensure any learnings from this process, as well as updates about the ATO changes to Income Tax Exemption reporting due in July 2024, can be shared in the form of additional targeted financial reporting seminars later in the year. This effort is ongoing.

A new financial reporting component is now being trialled to help quantify the community benefit contributed by the AOMC. To be able to report significant community benefits in this way is useful to demonstrate the valuable contribution we make directly to the general community, and adds to our credentials as we engage with external parties in our advocacy role. In coming months AOMC member clubs will also be asked to provide data about their own activities so that we can improve the reporting of the community benefits of the whole heritage vehicle movement. Stay posted.

**VicRoads/Club Permit Scheme Report.** AOMC have received reports of renewals being sent out without permit books. VicRoads have been contacted on this issue, but no reply as yet. Daryl Meek added that this will affect several thousand CPS holders. VicRoads are aware of the issue and this is the third major issue with the contractor. Can be rectified by ringing or attending VicRoads branch.

**AOMC Seminars.** Restoration and Club Management seminars have been held with good feedback from attendees. A lot of interest in ATO changes information from management seminar.

**Engine number records.** AOMC holds approx. 5 million records pre 1984. Over the past 3 months, 25 searches have been conducted.

#### **Delegates reports / General business:**

**Damian O'Doherty** (Ballarat V&CCC) asked about the progress on insurance cover for small clubs. Tony Hall responded that a sub committee are working on this and have had several meetings with brokers. Work is still going on in the background and Tony is confident that an offer will be finalised in 2024 for the consideration of AOMC members. Damian also asked about the joint effort with VicFed. Tony responded that there is a joint working committee from both organisations who have met with VicRoads, with the promise of further regular meetings. The joint committee have drafted a shopping list of issues that were presented to VicRoads. There have also been regular meetings of representatives of AOMC and VicFed that have been very cordial and constructive.

Iain Ross thanked delegates for attending, our guest speakers and especially thanked the Ballarat Vintage and Classic Car Club for hosting and catering the meeting. He declared the meeting closed at 2.45pm.


