## General Meeting Minutes

*Minutes of the General Meeting held Thursday 13<sup>th</sup> June 2024 at the clubrooms with 57 members and three visitors in attendance, and apologies from 11 members being recorded.*

The meeting commenced at 8pm with the President's welcome followed by an outline of meeting arrangements and hall safety features.

The passing of two members, Doug Cloak and Cath Simpson, was acknowledged by one minute's reflection.

**Minutes:**

Minutes of the May 9 meeting were accepted following the motion from *Lloyd Healey, 2<sup>nd</sup> Tony Farrugia*. No business arising.

**Correspondence:**

Barry Croke drew members' attention to two agencies that have added our club to their mailing list. Firstly, the Victorian Government advised that Land Tax of \$973 had been struck on our club's land which they valued at \$225,000. The second letter from Australian Tax Office advised that we were required to complete their six-page registration form in preparation for a self-review and reporting of our income tax liability following the conclusion of our financial year (September 30). These Victorian and Australian Government requests have been responded to in accordance with directions.

AOMC notified us of a Management Seminar on June 22 at Springvale to assist clubs work through the new ATO income tax liability.

Letters to Peter and Elizabeth Schulz, Rod Kelly and Gloria Baker advising them of the Committee's acceptance of membership applications.

A letter from member Phame McColl mentioning the desirability of pro-rata membership fees for new members and the absence of supper sandwiches was mentioned and it will be referred to the Committee.

Bendigo National Swap Meet sent a request seeking assistance from members of motoring clubs affiliated with the Federation. Volunteers for two-hour shifts on November 16, 17 and 18 are sought and our members who co-operate receive a \$10 refreshment allowance plus activate a \$20 payment to our club for each shift completed. Please advise Barry Croke and Lloyd Healey if you can volunteer at Bendigo so we can advise the Bendigo people by early August.

Newsletters from other clubs: copies of six mailed and 14 emailed and these available at side table.

**REPORTS:****Treasurer**

Peter Vibert tabled a two-page transaction report covering May 9 to June 13. Particular note was made of AOMC's provision of \$500 toward our National Heritage Day. A very late account from Shepp Hire for \$928 for hire of catering equipment used at our Swap Meet last September had been received. Account balances were mentioned as

presented in a one-page report. *Peter Vibert* moved, 2<sup>nd</sup> *Bruce Mellington*, that his report be accepted. Passed.

Peter Vibert tabled a one-page document "2024-25 Subscriptions". He mentioned that current \$70 subscriptions totalled \$14,000 annually, and that the club Journal was costing \$11,500 for printing, paper and postage. He sought approval for the following fee structure that would need to be ratified at our AGM, 2<sup>nd</sup> *Lloyd Healey*.

- 2024-25 Subscription of \$80 for members wishing to receive a mailed hard copy of the Journal, OR
- a \$30 subscription for members choosing to receive the Journal electronically.

The meeting approved this fee structure. Members will be advised in the next Journal with a special note for membership renewal.

**Federation report**

Lloyd Healey directed members to the report in the June Journal.

**Catering s/c**

Julie Mahoney noted the sale of our previous stove and mentioned her Journal report.

**Social s/c**

Trevor Dainton spoke about the June 15 gathering at the clubrooms.

**Facilities s/c**

Greg Sutherland mentioned the working bee attended by six members that achieved some spot-spraying of weeds and the spreading of 60 tonne of mulch that was assisted by a member's front-end loader.

**AOMC**

Alan Lavis indicated a report would be in the July Journal.

**GUEST SPEAKER**

Mr. Tim Davies, of Faram Ritchie Davies, provided an informative talk about "Power of Attorney" with particular emphasis on this arrangement being quite separate from a "Will" and of the desirability to appoint trusted persons (up to three) who live locally with the power of attorney. The advisability for formally arranging "Power of Attorney" with legal oversight was also noted.

Greg Sutherland thanked Tim for the address.

**GENERAL BUSINESS**

**1. Proposed changes** to the club's Constitution and By-laws.

Eight Special Resolutions had been circulated in last month's Journal to give members the required time for their consideration. President, Robin Fletcher, accepted a motion from *Peter Vibert, 2<sup>nd</sup> Gwyneth Trevaskis*, "that these resolutions be voted on as one". This was accepted. A subsequent motion "that the eight resolutions be approved" was moved by *Peter Vibert, 2<sup>nd</sup> Gwyneth Trevaskis* and a show of hands indicated 47 in favour. This exceeded the necessary 75% of members present at a general meeting. Therefore accepted.

In summary, these resolutions realign parts of our Constitution with recent changes to the Model Rules for Incorporated Associations in Victoria, and secondly, provide a membership application procedure that enables a fast club response and immediate access to club permit approval for eventual VicRoads registration of new member's heritage vehicles.

Allan Weeks asked that a note of appreciation be made for the work in achieving these resolutions, supported by acclamation.

**2. Club Windscreen Sash**

Barry Croke had made an initial enquiry on windscreen sash costs that are likely to be about \$26 each for order of ten. A show of hands indicated 15 interested members so actual arrangements will be negotiated.

**Buy, Swap and Sell**

Michael Gannon sought details of a Rochester upholsterer. Bill Winters brought along a gear stick with a key in the knob. He sought help in determining the origin and key function.



Neil Hammond mentioned the well-priced series of model cars available at newsagents.

**Reports from the floor**

Members mentioned attendance at the recent long weekend events at Winton, the Seymour historic train group's significant visit of carriages and locomotives to the district and the Echuca Steam Rally.

Additionally the restored and modified Japanese vehicles displayed at Shepparton Airport had attracted about 300 vehicles.

*The meeting was closed at 9.15pm.*

Just letting everyone know that the old stove has been sold and was picked up last month. Apart from that, it's been very quiet on the catering front.

At our sub-committee meeting this month, we'll be organising the catering for the A.O.M.C. meeting at M.O.V.E. on Saturday 24<sup>th</sup> August. Next year bigger and better? I should think so, be there for a great day. A valued event cast badge for our attendance was greatly appreciated by me.

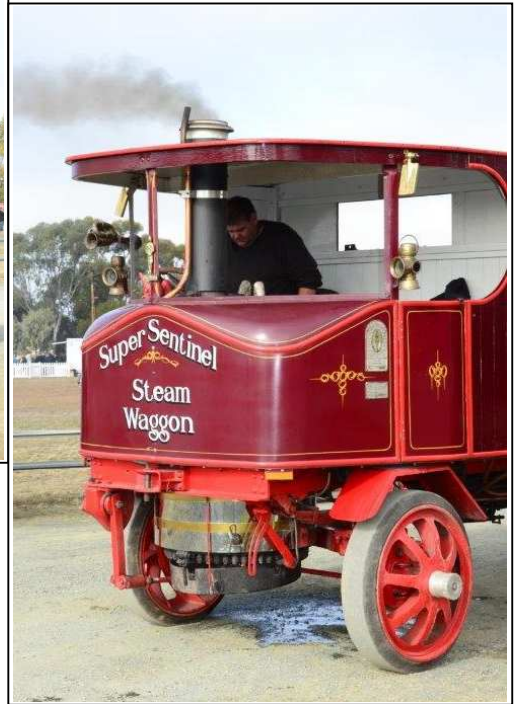

## AHMF Report

The Australian Historic Motoring Federation (AHMF) has forwarded details of an economic value study of our hobby by the Australian Motor Heritage Foundation (AMHF).



***Survey reveals Australia's historic vehicle owners spend over \$9.9 billion annually***

- Over 6,000 respondents across 800 motoring clubs in a nationwide Economic Value Study confirm close to \$10 billion in annual expenditure on historic vehicles
- An estimated 970,000 historic vehicles in Australia with owners spending close to \$10,240 per vehicle per year
- Australian Motor Heritage Foundation: "In carrying out this study, we have shown that the historic vehicle movement is a large and vibrant part of Australia's society and economy"

Sydney, 11th April, 2024 – The owners of Australia's historic vehicles spend some \$9.9 billion each year on their passion, according to a new survey.

The Economic Value Study (EVS) of well over 6000 Australian respondents, distributed to over 800 motoring clubs nationally, was conducted for the Australian Motor Heritage Foundation (AMHF) by The Mercurius Group (TMG). The Foundation is champions of Australia's motor heritage, and an organisation dedicated to promoting and preserving Australia's motoring history.

The enthusiast owners of an estimated 970,000 historic vehicles in Australia spend on average \$10,240 per vehicle annually, around 12.5% more than people who own daily driven cars. The historic vehicle fleet represents 4.4% of Australia's 21 million total vehicle fleet. Around 50% of the survey respondents own only one historic vehicle, the other 50% owning two or more vehicles. "Historic" vehicles are in two categories: those 15 to 30 years old defined as "classic" vehicles and those over 30 years old defined as "heritage" vehicles.

Such a survey has never been comprehensively undertaken on so wide a scope or on a national basis in Australia. Following publication of the similar landmark 2020 HERO-ERA study in the UK, the AMHF decided to find out what is the real figure for the economic contribution of historic vehicles for Australia.

"The findings of this report have certainly highlighted the significance of the historic vehicle sector to both the community at large and the economic sector," says Hugh King, Chairman of the AMHF.

"The response from Australia's motoring club members has been unprecedented: the economic modellers at TMG have never had so large a data pool to work with, proving motoring enthusiasts care as passionately about their historic vehicles as they do having their voices heard. In carrying out this study, we have shown that the historic vehicle movement is a large and vibrant part of Australia's society and economy."

The survey also reveals the total annual economic impact, including both direct and indirect expenditure, is \$25.2 billion: with the sector creating almost 79,000 jobs – 42,000 direct and 37,000 indirect. These jobs generate \$6.2 billion in wages and salaries annually. These are very large numbers by any standard.

Stavros Yallouridis, CEO of the Motor Traders' Association of NSW (MTA NSW), said the AMHF's survey gave yet more irrefutable evidence of the significant contribution of the automotive sector in the broader Australian economy.

"Despite the end of local vehicle manufacturing, Australia maintains a rich and diverse automotive industry, which employs hundreds of thousands of people across a range of roles," Mr Yallouridis said.

"The automotive sector is one of the backbones of our economy and is also at the heart of our communities. This survey, and the enthusiastic response, highlights the necessity for Australia to back its automotive sector with world-class training, local skills development and career pathways," he continued.

*Notes from the AOMC Delegates meeting, Springvale – 20<sup>th</sup> May 2024*

The first part of the meeting was a Special General Meeting to vote on three resolutions for changes to the Constitution that the Committee had proposed. The main one was to allow unincorporated clubs to belong to the AOMC. The other two resolutions were to make changes to better reflect current operations and practices.

The three resolutions were passed.



The Delegates meeting proper:

- Guest speakers were Carolyn Bock and Anna Rodway from the stage production “Garage Girls” based on Alice Anderson’s all-girl garage in Kew. Many delegates had seen the show, and recommended it.
- President Keith Mortimer reported that the AOMC/Fed working party have negotiated to have two meetings per year with the Department of Transport. The first meeting was to be on May 30<sup>th</sup>.
- The Treasurer reported that at the end of April, AOMC had Cash at Bank of \$271,072. This healthy position is important for the implementation of the group insurance scheme.
- A number of experiences with red plates were raised. In particular, VicRoads do not accept digital cut and paste signatures on renewal forms.

- Florence Thomson Tour: 84 lady drivers in vintage to modern classics toured Gippsland, based at Moe.
- National Motoring Heritage Day was celebrated in numerous events.
- AOMC Seminars: the club business seminar was to be on June 22<sup>nd</sup>. A Marketing and Social Media seminar will be held on July 22<sup>nd</sup>.

**Other Matters**

- Club Insurance: Hopefully the scheme will be up and running in October.
- Engine numbers: Information was provided on engine numbers researched. This is a good resource for researching engine number history.
- Delegates reports and General Business: a number of club activities were shared.

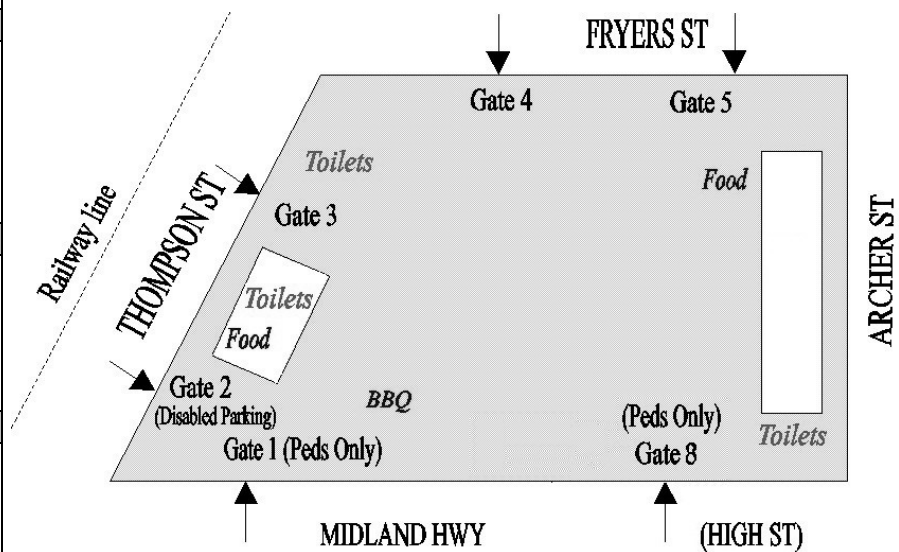

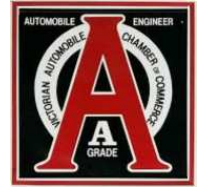
