



RURAL AID PROJECT LOCKINGTON

The Club visited Lockington for their mid-week run in August. I was disappointed to miss the day as I was involved in a Rural Aid Project in Lockington in May 2022 together with a number of volunteers working in the town and surrounding area.

It was such a welcoming community, the day before starting, we were given a bus tour of the areas we would be working at, a goodie bag with maps and brochures, a stubby holder, a mug a warm beanie and a voucher to use at a local business. Following this we went to the Heritage Centre for a Devonshire tea.

The starting date coincided with the Lions Club Swap Meet and Show n Shine, which was held adjacent to where we camped.

Sunday afternoon we met at the Heritage Centre for a welcome by Rural Aid staff and the local coordinator with a rundown of work expected. There was a welcome to country and smoking ceremony to follow, then a Sunday roast provided by the Heritage centre Volunteers. We used the Heritage Centre as our base where we had meals and meetings each day.

The volunteers were divided into 6 teams, each working on a different project.

- Rail trail fencing team 1 erecting a mesh fence on a property adjacent to the rail trail.
- Rail trail fencing team 2 as above working from the other end.
- Bowling club laying concrete between the rinks.
- Tennis Club rooms prep and painting the inside and outside of the building.
- Pony Club relining the male and female toilets and showers with colourbond sheeting.
- Senior Citizens rooms prep and painting the room.
- O'Briens shop at the heritage Centre dusting and rearranging items to make it a better display.

Each morning from Monday to Friday the teams would go to their sites with a packed morning tea at 8am, they would return for lunch which was provided by the catering volunteers then back to work returning again at 4pm. There was a meeting with the team leaders and the paid staff reporting on the days work. While the others generally got together for a drink and chat around the fire pit before dinner which was prepared by different volunteer groups in the town.

As they finished their projects others were found to make sure all were busy. Some tree planting at Waterwheel Court was carried out while others went to the Pine Grove cemetery to lay wire at the bottom of the fence to keep the rabbits out.

On the final night locals were invited and awards handed out; congratulations passed around on jobs well done. It is amazing what can be achieved in a week.

I was the roving reporter. I visited sites each day, took photos and wrote a run down to send to the Rural Aid head office in Brisbane so they knew what was happening. I left a copy at Lockington and kept a copy for myself.


